Inspired by his profound understanding of the Dhamma, he dedicated his life to teaching and preserving the Pāli language and its sacred texts apart from countless humanitarian activities. His vision for this project emerged from a desire to make the teachings accessible to all, ensuring that this knowledge transcends linguistic and cultural boundaries. This vision took shape from his experience at the Chattha Sangāyana in Yangon, Burma in the fifties, where he was one of the editors and published entire holy Tipitaka and commentaries in nearly 150 volumes.


